## A Peacekeeper's Perspective on Joy in Leadership

**Matina Jewell**, Global Keynote Speaker, Author & Thought Leader

During her 15-year military career, best-selling author Matina Jewell tracked down war lords, worked with the US navy seals, fast roped out of helicopters onto ships, and successfully led a UN peacekeeping mission in Lebanon where she found herself thrown into the middle of a devastating war.

Matina's lessons of resilience and leadership have transformed some of the country's biggest companies and her message of courage continues to empower leaders from all walks of life. Her story has audiences on their feet time and time again.

**ABSTRACT:** With enthralling footage, stories of hardship and valuable learning from her many life-threatening missions Matina will take you on a journey that will affect long lasting positive change in your leaders, teams and organisations for years to come.

## KEYNOTE 2

### JOY IN PRAYER



#### How Prayer Spaces in Schools Are Helping Students to Connect with God

Phil Togwell, Director, Prayer Spaces in Schools, a Ministry of 24-7, UK

Phil Togwell lives on the North-East coast of England with his family (one wife, three daughters, two dogs). He trained and worked in a wide range of Youth & Community Work settings before serving as 24-7 Prayer's UK Director for seven years. Phil now leads the national and international Prayer Spaces in Schools teams, and the Anglican Diocese of Durham's Prayer Project. He speaks and delivers training at conferences, and he continues to lead prayer spaces in schools and youth groups in his local area. Phil likes curry, mountains and Star Trek.

**ABSTRACT:** Prayer spaces enable children and young people, of all faiths and none, to explore faith, spirituality and life's big questions in a safe, creative and interactive way. Since 2008, Prayer Spaces in Schools have trained local Christians in many nations to host more than 2000 prayer spaces in school classrooms, and close to a million students have participated in them, many praying personal prayers for the first time in their lives. During this session, Phil will reflect on why prayer spaces are working, and how we can use them to develop the spiritual life of our school communities.

## KEYNOTE 3

### JOY IN STORY TELLING



#### Joy in Story: A Journey to Saga Iceland

Associate Professor Kári Gíslason, Creative Industries Faculty, Queensland University of Technology

Kári Gíslason was born in Reykjavík in 1972. He moved to England at the age of ten, and then to Australia four years later. His memoir, *The Promise of Iceland* (2011), describes return journeys that he has made to his birthplace, and in 2015 he published his debut novel, *The Ash Burner*. He is co-creator (with Richard Fidler) of *Saga Land* (2016), an ABC radio series about Iceland. Kári was awarded a doctorate in 2003 for his thesis on medieval literature. He is noted for his articles, travel journalism, and reviews. Kári is currently Associate Professor of Creative Writing and Literary Studies at QUT.

**ABSTRACT:** Kári barely knew his father, and the two met on only four occasions. But at their last meeting, when they spoke about Kári's hope of one day being a writer, his father offered him a gift, a mystery. He told Kári that he wanted to write because he was descended from Snorri Sturluson, the most famous of Iceland's medieval saga authors, a man who'd died in 1241. At the time of their conversation, Kári had no way of knowing whether his father was right. But fifteen years later, he resolved to return to Iceland to find out. Was he descended from Snorri? And, if so, did it matter?

## KEYNOTE 4

### JOY IN DATA



#### **Measuring The Learning We Value**

Maddie Scott-Jones, Director of Communities, Education Changemakers

Maddie is the Director of Communities at Education Changemakers and brings an exemplary teaching career to her work with the global EC tribe. An alumna of the Changemaker Program, her change initiatives focused on helping children to embrace failure and increasing entrepreneurial resilience, which has seen her become a judge at the National Science Talent Search, speak at conferences across Australia and support her students to win the National Maths Talent Quest. As a teacher, Maddie taught secondary Science and Mathematics and was the coordinator for Gifted and Talented Students and Student Leadership. She holds three Masters degrees with distinction in Science and Education from the University of Melbourne and the Australian Catholic University.

**ABSTRACT:** Great teachers understand the importance of knowing their students. They know how to nurture the passions of students in a way that builds their character. They know the link between passion and engagement and how they contribute to the development of joyful, lifelong, successful learners. Such teachers have a gift in unleashing the potential of the students through developing and harnessing their passions to help them create a better world. What if this gift could be given to all teachers, as a guide or set of tools to improve the lives and education of all students to enable great teaching and joyful learning?

### JOY IN SERVICE



#### **Joy the Most Infallible Sign of the Presence of God**

Br Damien Price, Coordinator of Developing Nations / Brother, Oceania Province of the Christian Brothers

Br Damien Price is a Christian Brother of the Oceania Province. Damien has worked in schools for over 40 years in a variety of roles. He has a Masters Degree in Counselling and a Masters degree in Pastoral Guidance. His Doctoral studies looked at the meaning making young adults engaged in as they worked with the homeless of the inner city of Brisbane. Damien is passionate about the power of story to transform our world. A native of Proserpine in North Queensland, Damien currently lives in community in Brisbane and supports the work of the Brothers in PNG, Timor Leste and the Philippines.

**ABSTRACT:** The famous Jesuit Teilhard de Chardin once said, "Joy is the most infallible sign of the presence of God!" In this presentation Br Damien will break open what he calls 'in points' on the journey of adolescent meaning-making. An in-point is that space of 'heart readiness' to go deeper, to engage one's heart questions, to find meaning and to experience the transcendent in its many forms. Damien will provide a psychological map that supports this journey and invite participants to deepen their own experience of where, when and how youth go beyond to that 'magis' point – the 'more' that this world cannot give.

This fast-paced session will enable you to hear from seven different speakers, each speaking for seven minutes on seven different aspects of Joy.

Some of these speakers work in our schools, while others are involved in the wider Anglican community. Each will surprise you with their expression of Joy in their work, their interests and their life. While each speaker will outline their own passion, what is common to all is an overwhelming sense of Joy and a willingness to share that with us. This will be a unique experience for all.
